

Artistic Director & Choreographer Executive Director Tasha Patterson Shirley

Tasha's dance students have graced the stages of the Treasure Coast for over twelve years. Audiences rave about the energy and passion of the shows created and performed by the Wings to Fly Dance Company. The shows *Quest* (2010 & 2011), *Time* (2012), *Life* (2013), *Journey*

(2016), and *Hope* (2018) were emotional and memorable masterpieces that staged the incredible talents of local performers. "It's rewarding to inspire performers to reach beyond perceived limits and discover their full potential."

Before moving to Florida, Tasha lived in Japan and performed with Madonna, Christopher Cross, Dianna Ross, Earth Wind and Fire, and Cyril Takayama (magician). With 28 years of experience, she has worked as a choreographer in Guys and Dolls, Rocky Horror Picture Show, Cats, Geki Dan Shiki, and for many contemporary dance companies here and abroad. Music videos include Namie Amuro, Southern Allstars, and Salt N Pepa. She created events and shows for Budweiser, Coca Cola, Toyota, MAC Makeup, Prada, Sony, Virgin Cinemas and various cabaret shows. Commercials include Glico, Sony, Pizza Hut, Swatch, and Suzuki.

Tasha is the Executive Director of WTFDC. Tasha works with her family to create an exciting diverse repertoire, engaging in unique collaborations with a wide variety of talent.



Founding Director Dancer Tena Patterson

Tena's impressive repertoire as a professional dancer, teacher and choreographer bloomed in Toronto with the National Ballet School and by 18 with Vancouver's Pacific Ballet Company. Theater dancing in shows like West Side Story, Guys and Dolls Gypsy, & Oklahoma plus Telethons

filled her dance card. In 1995 she formed the Florida Performing and Visual Arts Program for persons with disabilities with the Arc of St. Lucie County. Believing "everyone should have the opportunity to perform", her work continues with WTFDC. Tena also writes children's books, the latest, *Friendly the 911 Kite*, is for sale at Barnes and Noble. Now 74, she shows us all how it's done!

Tara has been employed by the Martin Health System for over 14 years as a Physical Therapy Assistant and their Employee of the Year in 2018! She was the Assistant Supervisor for individuals with disabilities at the Arc of St. Lucie County for over 10 years. Her

background as a professional dancer included working on Princess Cruises, performing with Diana Ross, C&C Music Factory and Cyndi Lauper. Her extensive experience with therapy and with individuals with disabilities gives her an exceptional insight on how to facilitate experiences beyond what you could think possible. Tara has a sincere appreciation for creativity and exploration of music and movement and shares that love with her students. She conceived the Freedom Harness years ago and continues to expand this wonderful program. She is thrilled to be with WTFDC integrating dancers with and without disabilities.



Ana Bolt-Turrall – *Guest Artist* Ana Bolt Turrall (MFA, CPT, PMA) An educator for over 26 years. My sense of purpose through dance is to live, serve, contribute, and to express my gratitude to God. My mission as we move through the graces of aging is to ignite in those who, like me, are starting a new chapter in their 50's to keep on dancing and choreograph

life with constant evolvement and learning of the 'self'. I have been invited to perform in France, Miami and Minnesota in 2019. My travels for dance and Pilates workshops enable me to share my own personal movement experiences, which involve mixed modalities that generate a creative and balanced synergy for the body. has shaped Mikayla's perspective of not just her own dancing, but her overall outlook on life and people. "Working with Casey, Sabrina, Alex, and everyone else in HOPE changes how you look at yourself and the people around you. You start to realize how unimportant it is to be able to kick your leg as high or do as many turns as your fellow dancers, and you learn to appreciate the privilege to just move and express through dance. Wings To Fly has given me the opportunity to work with individuals that I would have never otherwise known, but who have made such a powerful positive impact on my day to day life, and for that I am eternally grateful".



Joneik Molyneaux - Dancer

Dance holds a special place in my heart, from the moment I started. When I dance I feel like I can suddenly breathe, I feel as if I'm invincible, reborn. Dance is my life and has indeed changed my life in numerous ways. One thing I have learned as a dancer is perseverance. When you fall or make a mistake, courage is needed for you to get

back up and try again. Dance to me means *freedom*, freedom to move and express yourself in ways you didn't think was possible. Working with WTFDC has taught me the true meaning of freedom – the condition of being free from restraints. Dancing with people in wheelchairs has brought the statement of *anyone can dance* to life for me. They have taught me to slow down and take the time to just look around and take in this beautiful world and all of the simple joys we are blessed to encounter every day. Seeing a smile on their faces every chance they get to dance makes me as a person even more grateful for dance myself. Working with Wings to Fly has changed me for the better.



Kaileigh Bates – Dancer Kaileigh was born in CT and started dance at age 2, shortly after her family moved to Florida. Starting at Florida Arts & Dance, with one of her teachers being Tasha, she progressed on to Dance Academy of Stuart, and finally rejoined Tasha at WTFDC! Very active in the local theatre, she performed with Shiloh Theatrical productions. She

now finds herself spreading her love of dance teaching at FADC and Danceworks! Through FADC, she works with local high schools and teaches dance to the special needs classes! Wings to Fly has enabled her to follow her dreams in integrating individuals with and without disabilities through dance. Now, she finds herself embraced by the very essence of WTFDC by receiving the training to follow in Tara Anstensen's dance steps by harnessing her own special dancer! She will be forever grateful for such a heartwarming opportunity! Jennifer started her dance training in Palm Beach with Linda White, Charles Russell and Joan Miller, then at the Dreyfoos School of the Arts in WPB as a ballet major with Jeffrey Satinoff, Garry Lewis and Stacy Porcher. At 16, Jennifer attended PA Ballet Company's 6-week summer intensive program. Graduating Dreyfoos,

she then taught ballet, jazz, lyrical and modern throughout PB County. She also instructed ESOL students and choreographed audition pieces for Bach Middle School of the Arts. Jennifer relocated to Port St. Lucie and continues to teach her passion. This is her second year at SFDC teaching ballet, leaps and turns, and choreography. 
